Diego Rivera: A Man and His Murals

Diego Rivera In December of 1886 in Guanajuato, a silver-mining town in central Mexico, twins, Diego Maria Rivera and Carlos Maria Rivera were born on the eighth of December Two years later Carlos died and in 1891 a sister was Maria was born The family moved to Mexico City in 1893 Both of Diego Rivera's parents were school teachers

Diego Rivera - "Delfina Flores"

The theme of Rivera's work centers on social and political issues His father was a political activist Social issues both around the world and particularly in Mexico influenced Rivera Diego Rivera painted Delfina Flores in 1927 when he was forty years old At about this time he also began painting murals Most of his murals are in Mexico
